



Myrtle Beach Bikers Urge COMMON SENSE At Rallies

A scaled-down version of the Myrtle Beach Fall Bike Rally is being held despite the threat of coronavirus, with bikers riding to south strand area bars to take part in the 81st annual event.

The week-long event kicks off September 28th to October 4th, and riders across the southeast are looking forward to "The Carolina's Largest Motorcycle Event". If it is anything like the Spring Rally, everyone will be having fun, riding up and down the coast, relaxing on the beach, and wearing masks in restaurants and retail stores.

Typically, the event attracts over a quarter million visitors to Horry and Georgetown County over the entire week, but no one is exactly sure what attendance will look like, or how many motorcycles will be on the South Strand this year.

Several members of our National Academy of Motorcycle Injury Lawyers will be at the event – including Justin Lovely, our association President, and Ken Hardison, our Founder. Stop by their booth and say hello if you get a chance!

Leslye Beaver, owner of The Beaver Bar in Murrells Inlet, decided to close their indoor venue and keep things outside under their pavilion. "It really has actually worked pretty good this year, even with the governor's executive order prohibiting the sale of alcohol after 11 p.m."

Sonny Copeland, the organizer of Myrtle Beach Bike Week, encourages common sense. "This is the land of the free and the home of the brave, not the land of obey and home of the sheep... Just be safe and use common sense," said Copeland. While concerts are outlawed by executive order, musicians still perform for the crowd. "You can't lock yourself in a closet. You've got to keep living," said one biker at the spring rally... a sentiment that is shared by many this fall.

Many bikers at the 80th Anniversary of the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally in South Dakota said they were not very concerned about the spread of coronavirus. The news media played up the pictures of people with no masks, out walking on the streets. However, no masks were required by the governor, and the design on one T-shirt read "Screw COVID, I'm going to Sturgis."

The Recidivist: A Tattooed Motorcycle?!

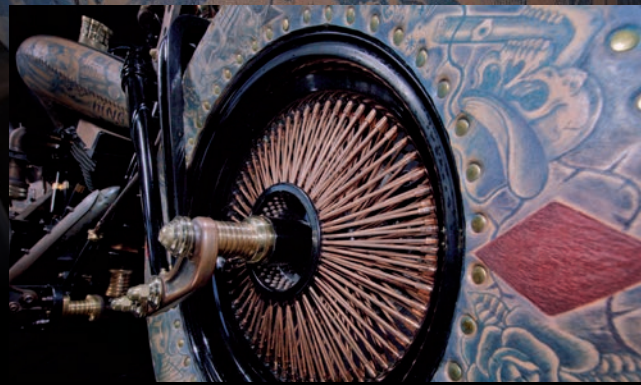
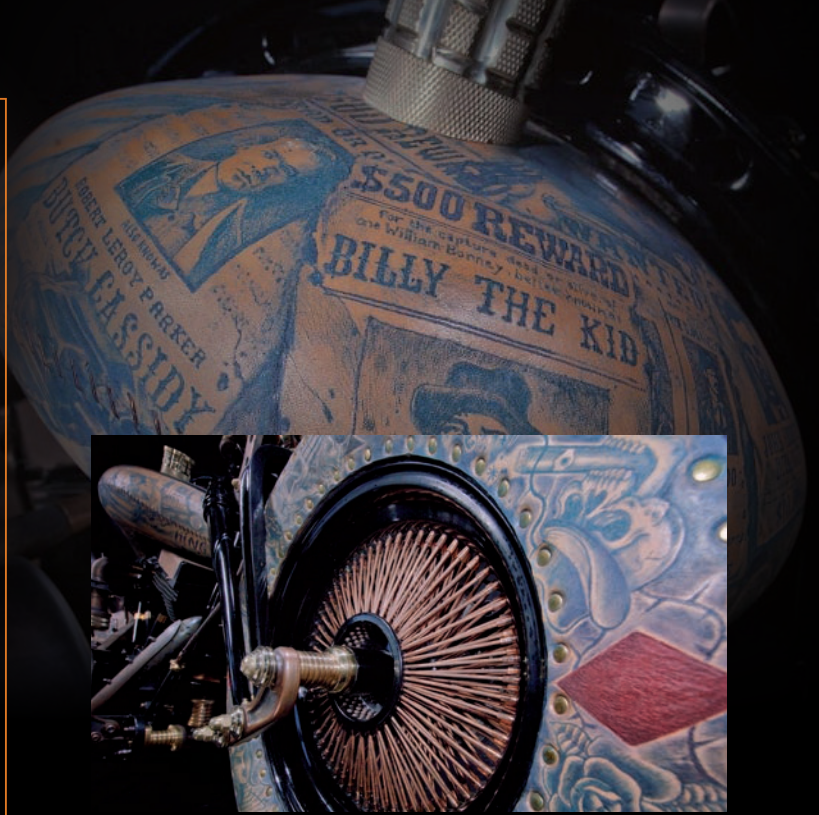
YES! More than 3,000 hours went into the construction of this wildly unique, custom build by Game Over Cycles. Then an additional 2,500 hours were spent tattooing every surface of the motorcycle and side car by hand, including the tank. Even the tires are tattooed!

You can't actually tattoo metal, so the entire bike was first wrapped in a thin layer of cowhide leather to simulate human skin. Images include Wanted Posters for Butch Cassidy and Billy the Kid, along with a storyline of a bank robbery and prison break.

Almost every component on the motorcycle is one-of-a-kind. The front suspension has the look of a traditional coil tattoo machine. The front calipers look like handcuffs. The ignition plug is made using a modern tattoo gun. And as an extra touch, the exhaust pipe has a set of tattooing needles that move in-and-out like they are applying ink when you start the bike.

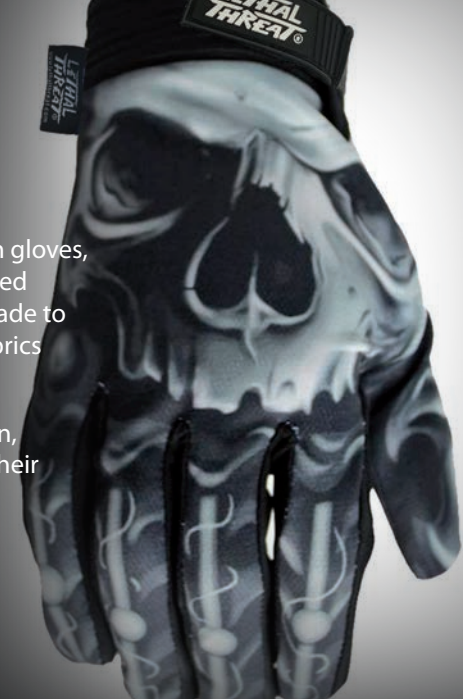

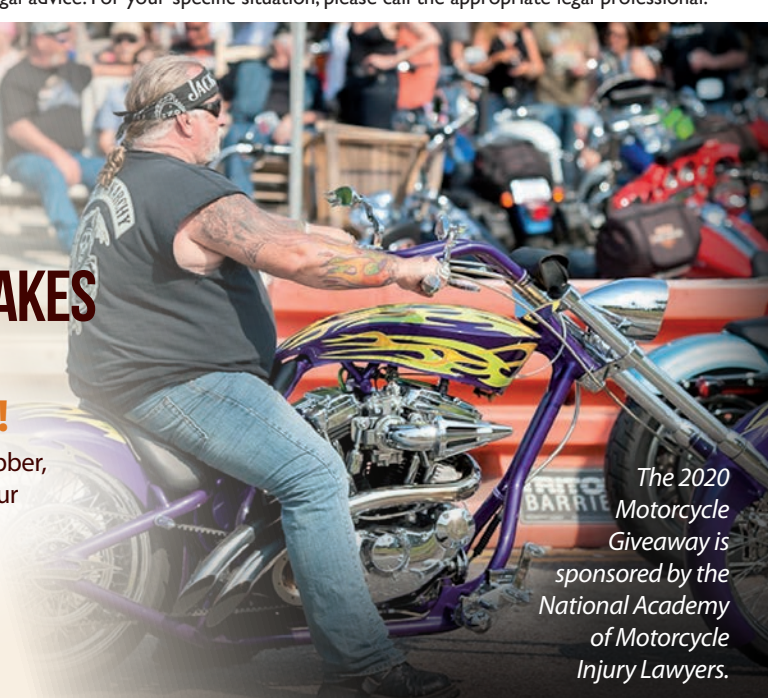
