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Fall is on its way, so now is the time to start planning your next road trip if you want to experience peak leaf colors along with the twists and turns that make for the best Autumn rides. While there are loads of options all across this beautiful country of ours, here are a few that top the list.

- 1) Blue Ridge Parkway in North Carolina and Virginia:** It's 469 miles of splendor most anytime of the year, but especially when the fall colors are in peak performance. This exceptional parkway links the Shenandoah National Park in Virginia with the Great Smoky National Park in North Carolina. Most of the trek is a 45 MPH zone, so you can take in the scenery while enjoying this well-maintained stretch of roadway. Hop on and hop off all along the route to discover sleepy mountain towns, great hikes and waterfalls.
- 2) Lake Michigan, MI:** If you're up for spectacular color along the northern shores, this ones for you. There's 100 miles of opportunity along Grand Traverse Bay and you'll be flanked by miles of fir, pine and spruce in all their glory. You can discover charming fishing towns and attractions such as the Grand Traverse Lighthouse and the Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore.
- 3) Gunnison-Crested Butte, CO:** This is home to the country's largest aspen grove so you can expect to see mind-blowing color in the Fall. Add majestic mountain vistas and canyon drops of Gunnison National Park via the West Elk Loop and you've got the makings of a rewarding roundtrip here.
- 4) Route 6 in Pennsylvania:** This scenic beauty has been named "one of America's most scenic drives" by National Geographic Travel and endorsed by Harley Davidson as Pennsylvania's best touring route. You've got 400 miles of open road with loads of loop trail options designed specifically for Motorcycle Riders.
- 5) Cadillac Mountain, Maine:** This state is made for scenic rides and fall color amidst mountains, ocean, forests and quaint new England towns. While you can crisscross this little state and find loads of picturesque rides this fall, make sure you take Bar Harbor's Cadillac Mountain Summit Road to Cadillac Mountain for show stopping color and mountain majesty guaranteed to give you some amazing photo ops.

STOP THE STINK

The Do's and Don'ts for a Clean Helmet

If you spent much time on your bike over the summer, there's a good chance your helmet has the fragrance to prove it. Oils from your hair and months of perspiration can really do a number on anyone's helmet. Fortunately, there's a simple and inexpensive solution to rid your helmet of these pungent odors!

Here are the Do's and Don'ts for getting your helmet squeaky clean and smelling nice just in time for your fall road trips.



DON'TS:

Don't use standard over-the-counter cleaning products. Many have ingredients that can be harmful to your helmet and may damage your anti-fog/glare coating.

- ❑ Don't use glass cleaner. Most glass cleaners contain ammonia and ammonia can break down the shatterproof qualities of polycarbonate, a common material for motorcycle helmet.
- ❑ Don't use abrasive cleaning sponges or brushes when cleaning your helmet. These can scratch and erode the surface.
- ❑ Don't use aerosol compressed air to clean the helmet's vents. Aerosol can erode the EPS liner.

DO:

- ❑ Do use clean, soft microfiber cloths.
- ❑ Do use baby shampoo as the cleaning agent for soaking/cleaning the inside of your helmet. It's petroleum based and won't harm the interior padding or erode or compromise the helmet.

Easy Steps to Clean your Helmet:

- 1) Place a microfiber cloth that has been soaked in warm water over the outside of your helmet and leave it for 15-20 minutes.
- 2) Carefully remove all the internal lining and padding and soak in a solution of warm water and baby shampoo for several hours, working the solution into the material.
- 3) Gently clean the helmet with warm water, using a microfiber cleaning cloth. Dry by hand, using another microfiber cloth.
- 4) After soaking the lining material for several hours or overnight, rinse the lining thoroughly and let it dry overnight.
- 5) Use a soft bristle toothbrush as needed to wipe/clean air vents.
- 6) Carefully re-insert the lining and padding.

WHERE THE BUFFALO ROAM: Western Colorado Rides

In the mid 1800's there were 30-60 million American Buffalo roaming the plains of the western United States, including western Colorado. What the Buffalo knew, and what many riders are starting to discover is that the western part of that state is one of the best places to ride in the entire country.

Central Colorado boasts the heart of the Rockies, which are majestic and beautiful and a ride over any of the passes is an experience all to itself. But head a little farther west and the variety of your riding experiences expands exponentially.

Cutting along the southern edge of the Rio Grande National Forest you are met with a combination of valleys and wooded hills. Heading north out of Durango you run along the famed "Million Dollar Highway" which lives up to its namesake and more as one of the truly remarkable roads in the lower 48.

Cutting further west to Gateway brings you into a proper western movie with the Dolores River rolling through the red rock and desert-like fauna. You start with sheer walls on both sides and then it opens into a wider valley where you wouldn't be surprised to see John Wayne riding by.

At the far western edge of Colorado is the Colorado National Monument which is 24 miles of twisty roads and beautiful rock formations. While the Rockies have earned their reputation for epic riding, don't miss out on one of the most unique and exciting rides you'll ever take by venturing further and heading a bit farther west.

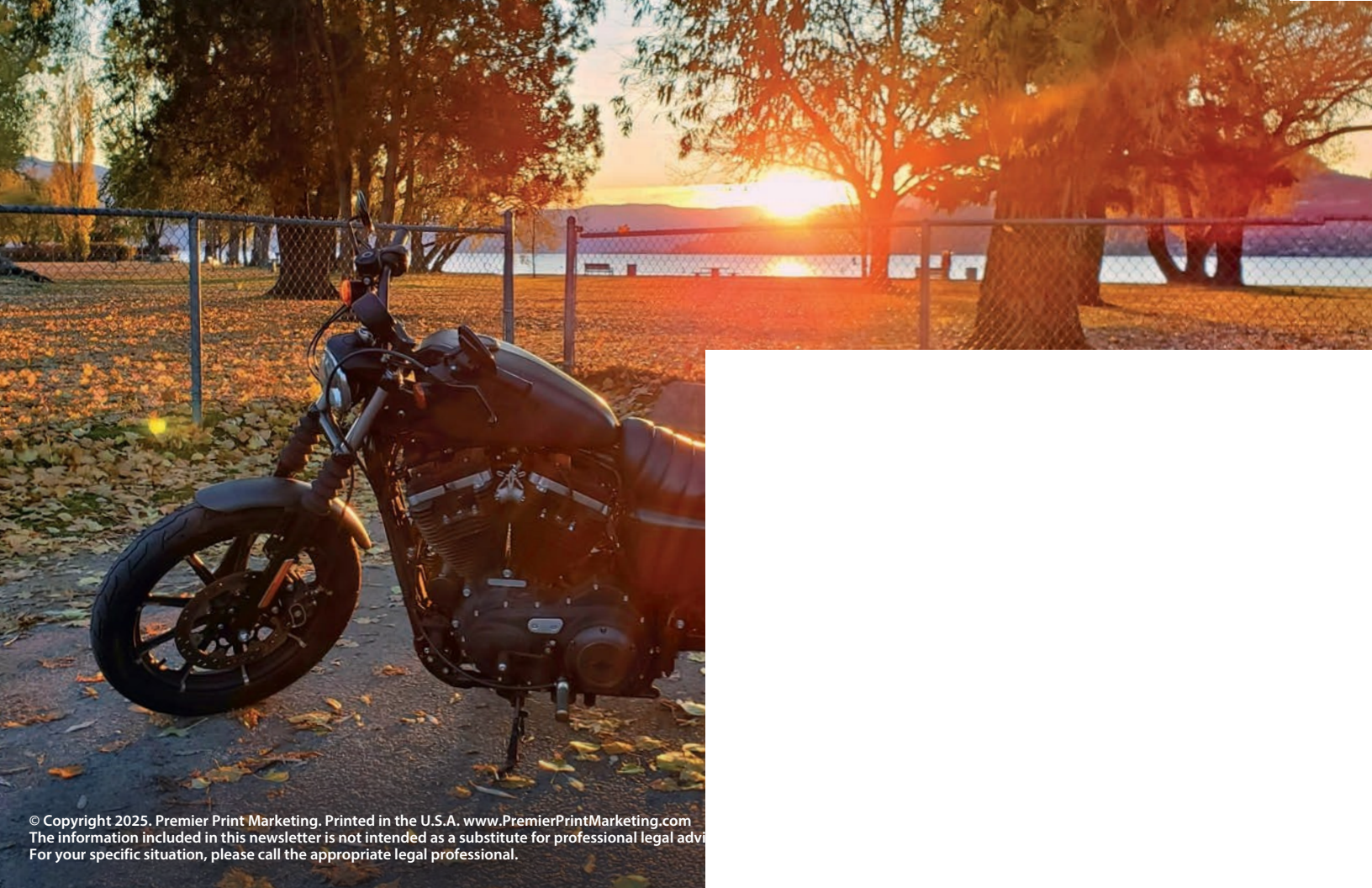
